March/April Ministry Update

Walk for Peace—On March 1, our LightHouse team had the opportunity to participate in a walk for peace with the community of Parrita. This area has been experiencing a rise in violence over the last several months and this walk was organized by local organizations, community members, and high schoolers to raise support and share their voice amidst the pain and fear. It was an incredible opportunity to physically walk alongside students in this. This was a very impactful experience for me as students took turns speaking out against the violence to the streets of Parrita. It was very evident that God was present and that many of the students believed that only He can bring the peace that these people need. Praise God that He is working and active in this community. Please continue to pray for peace for the people of Parrita and that the light and hope of Christ would shine brightly amidst the unrest, fear, and grieving.

Easter on the Beach—Easter was my biggest motivation to learn how to drive our manual team car and generally learn how to drive in the craziness of Costa Rica. This was necessary because many of my teammates were away for Holy Week and Easter and therefore wouldn't be around to drive me to church on Sunday and the buses would not be running early enough for me to make it to the sunrise service in time. It was a great motivator and I praise God for His provision! It was a beautiful experience to spend Easter in a new culture and in a new way. Easter morning, my teammate Janine and I woke up long before the sun was up and made it to Esterillos Oeste for the sunrise service on the beach. We also had the opportunity to attend a church in another city that is a bit more touristy and therefore had a service in English. What a blessing it was to worship in my heart language once again!

Trip to Guapiles— During Holy Week, I had the opportunity to travel to Guapiles which is a city in the Limon province, a new part of Costa Rica for me. This trip was very bucket-filling for me and a great chance to continue building relationships. In Guapiles, we were able to attend their Good Friday Procession. As you might know, most of Latin America, and therefore Costa Rica, is considered to be a Catholic country. This means that Holy Week is a very important time for them and these processions are a big part of their traditions. The procession was focused around the Catholic stations of the cross and was portrayed in a play-like manner throughout the streets of Guapiles. This was a really neat cultural experience!

Continued Ministry in the High School—We have been so excited with how consistent we have been able to be in the Parrita High School. It has been such a blessing to see the impact it has had on the students as they begin to realize that we are here to support them and we are here to stay. It fills me up each time a student walks up to one of us asking if we'll be here again tomorrow. And of course, the answer is always "yes"!

The Ascension of our Lord, Jesus Christ

A lthough we have passed May 9, we cannot forget the Ascension of our Lord. That would be like passing by Christmas or Easter with no mention of them. You promised as You ascended that you would come again to judgment. Help us to celebrate the Feast of the Ascension that we may rise above the things of earth to better and holier living, and that when You come again we may receive You with gladness of heart.

O Christ, You rule and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit eternal in the heavens. May we acknowledge Your rule and trust Your authority as the omnipresent, omniscient, omnipotent Triune God.

Since the day Your disciples lost sight of You, some of us have thought You far away, and have forgotten Your rule over us. O Lord, whose rule sets us free, forgive us.

Magnesium is Essential for Life and Health


Magnesium is one of the most important nutrients for human beings. We cannot manufacture it in our bodies and, we cannot live without it. Magnesium supports and regulates a wide range of bodily functions: blood glucose control, regulation of blood pressure and blood vessel function which leads to the prevention of blood clots, bone health, and strength, energy production, muscle activity, nerve function, and protein synthesis. An adult body contains about 25 grams of Magnesium, nearly 60 percent which is in the bones, while 30 percent is found in protein (muscles). Chronic deficiency of Magnesium is associated with high blood pressure, all heart disorders, strokes, seizures, coma, asthma, chronic fatigue, and depression. In addition, medical studies suggest that Magnesium deficiency contributes to the aging process itself, and increases vulnerability to age-related diseases. Studies have shown that most American eat too much processed foods that contain little Magnesium. Magnesium can be taken orally, but absorption of the supplement form is not the best way. It is better to get Magnesium from organic foods: green leafy vegetables, fruits, nuts (almonds, walnuts, peanuts), pumpkin seeds, chia seeds, black beans, eggs, salmon, potatoes, and yogurt. It is also very important to avoid alcohol and foods high in refined sugar, salt, flour, and oils.
