Lutheran Women in Mission (LWML)

he *Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML)* was established on July 7, 1942 at St. Stephen's Lutheran Church, Chicago, Illinois (just a few months before the United States entered World War II). This women's ministry was encouraged by the leadership of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod (LCMS). Historically, the LCMS and other church bodies have grappled with the appropriate roles for women in the church. By the establishment of the LWML, the LCMS was blessing the mission of the LWML as a vital way in which women could serve the Lord and be of service in the world.

In modern times, we have shortened our name to "Lutheran Women in Mission," but we still use our tradi-

tional LWML logo and graphics. The LWML mission statement is: "As Lutheran Women in Mission, we joyfully proclaim Christ, support missions, and equip women to honor God by serving others." We meet our goals through a variety of activities including helping women to grow spiritually and in Christian fellowship through Bible study, workshops, retreats, and rallies; helping and encouraging local Christian charities/agencies to apply for LWML grants; appointing Grace Knoxville dele-

gates to vote on grant selection for our district convention; attending district and national conventions; collecting mites; educating the congregation about the current grants that the LWML is supporting; and finding unique ways to serve our congregation and community.

We welcome woman of all ages (and men are welcome to attend our gatherings also). LWML also has a Young Woman Representative (YWR) program that encourages and provides some funding for young women to attend our conventions. Here at Grace Lutheran, Knoxville, we have an active LWML and are always looking for leaders and workers to further our mission. Our current Grace LWML leadership team is the following ladies:



Body Fat Predicts Health Better than Body Mass Index (BMI)

study published in "Frontiers in Nutrition" says that a person's percentage of body fat is a much more reliable indicator of overall health and cardiovascular risk than the Body Mass Index (BMI), which is based on weight and height. The BMI is a tool that health care providers use to estimate the amount of body fat by using an individual's height and weight measurements. It can help assess risk factors for certain health conditions. Israeli scientists analyzed data on 3,000 men and women and found that about one-third were of normal weight. Of those, however, 38.5 percent of women and 26.5 percent of men were judged to be overweight based on their percentage of body fat. When the scientists matched body fat percentage with blood markers, they found a significant correlation between "obesity with normal weight" and high levels of sugar, fat, and cholesterol, which are major risk factors for several cardiometabolic diseases. Researcher Yftach Gepner, Ph.D., said, "These individuals, being within the norm according to the prevailing BMI index, usually pass under the radar. Unlike people who are identified as overweight, they receive no treatment or instructions for changing their nutrition or lifestyle, which places them at an even greater risk for cardiometabolic diseases." At the same time, 30 percent of men and 10 percent of women identified as overweight by BMI were found to have a normal percentage of body fat.
